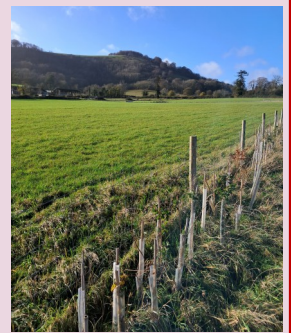

Although not all of our now **11,000 hedging trees** planted have been in the PARK, a fair proportion have been over the 6 years.

Our **work with landowners** is continuing apace. We find and plant hedges, giving **support** and **advice** on **increasing biodiversity** here; what a great and dedicated crowd they are. Now over 20 places, forming **a wonderful mosaic for wildlife**, to spread their genes out from the excellent Steyning Downland Scheme into the surrounding countryside.

STEYNING FESTIVAL TEA AND TREES TOUR

SFT are working with the Steyning Festival Team on **our Tree Tour 30th May, 2026, 3 - 7pm** where you will be able to see them. You can go by bike, car or on foot to see **these hidden gems** in and around Steyning. Situated in lovely parts of our town in beautiful settings, with nature and hedges being nurtured to **increase biodiversity**. As well as tea at Mouse Cottage. Come and sit in **our re-natured garden**, or conservatory, providing a home for wildlife now including **hedgehogs**. We can't guarantee that they will appear for you but it is a **haven for wildlife** as well as the lovely flowering plants that have always been here. Hopefully the **damselflies** and **dragonflies** that breed in the pond here, will, if it is warm enough, make an appearance. **Something to look forward to.**





Our hedge/wildlife corridor planting is continuing apace, a **wonderful wide hedge** at the Bowls Club increasing the different types of hedge plants with a better chance of supporting **endangered** species. No longer a monoculture so disease will not rip through it. A hedge near the river in Bramber. It will when it reaches maturity **suck up flood water** as well as providing another wide hedge to **shelter nature**. The owners are so dedicated to increasing **biodiversity**.

An **additional wildlife corridor/hedge** at [St Columba](#) has been planted with help from **SFT** ensuring that area of the Downs is well covered. **SFT** paid for the last one. But this one is now part of the SDNPA [Trees for the Downs](#) Scheme and has been provided by them but planted by **SFT** and St. Columba.

Also we have been helping the Steyning Grammar School by ordering and advising on the **right tree mixture** for their 420 free hedge plants, selected by **SFT**, donated by the Woodland Trust and **helping** them and their teachers plant it. We are donating the recycled canes and spirals as we saw a **deer** there. We were so **pleased** to see **so many students and parents** (23) coming on the Sunday at short notice; it was re-arranged from the wet Saturday. **Many thanks** to Jayne Michalska, Wellbeing Mentor, Outdoor Learning. They quickly grasped the idea of how and why we were planting. Some of the students asking very **pertinent questions** of the SFT team who managed to answer these keen young people.

The LNR [Strategy for Nature Recovery](#) has completed its consultation phase; what a **wonderful scheme** it is supporting **endangered** species. It is nationwide with particular areas chosen, East and West Sussex are included. Hopefully this will cheer up Chris Packham. **SFT** is certainly **very keen to help** as we are already doing this, we have the **expertise** with 3 ecologists and a volunteer with a zoology degree on our team.

Remember: Trees are front-line warriors in the fight against climate change.
